

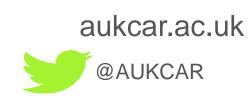

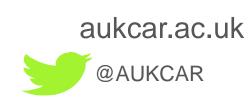


Who are we?

- Over 50 doctoral students and research fellows







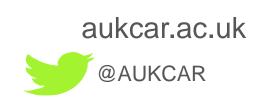
Why do our volunteers work with us?

Financial compensation for PPI

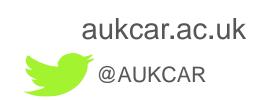
